Financial Assistance...

Women's Connection membership dues contribute to grants and scholarships. We offer various options for reduced fees to make attendance accessible:

- **childcare grant** – to relieve some of the costs of childcare encountered by mothers who attend our retreats, a reduced registration fee of up to \$20 is available to those who request it.
- **ministerial student grant** – our membership recognizes the importance of supporting our ministers in training. We offer one ministerial grant of \$100 on a first-apply-first-receive basis for ministerial students from the district.
- **need-based grant** – limited funds are available to reduce the financial burden for women who could not otherwise attend due to monetary hardship.
- **first-time attendees grant** – to encourage new members to participate in the retreat, the first five women to register, who are new to the retreat, will receive a waiver of their registration fees.

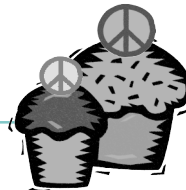
