Plan to be at the Allerton Institute from noon June 14 through noon June 16 to help explore these important questions. The registration fee is \$5.00 now, \$7.00 if you wait to register at Allerton. Board (3 lunches, 2 breakfasts, and 2 dinners) and room will be \$41 in multiple bed set-ups, and \$53 for single rooms.

Carol Reitan, active in Illinois politics, will be our keynote speaker and will ask us to take a look at a 'Web of Governmental Waste". A "Happening" will demonstrate some of our "Personal Webs of Waste", and workshops will include background, ''Knowhow'', and leadership training designed to help participants tackle their back-home problems in prison reform, local welfare programs, women's special concerns, youth concerns, The chronically mentally ill, time budgand new ways to conserve materials and human well-being.

Wednesday afternoon will be reserved for mini-workshops or mini-trips. The workshops will cover Elder Hostels (college for senior citizens), ERA, the Clara Barton Camp, and a chance to exchange ideas for money-making church activities. Tour materials will be provided to those who wish to wander to points of interest in Central Illinois.

There will be two evenings of fun; one, "Recycling Old TV programs", and the second, a "Miss Used Allerton" pagent

and contest (bring something from a former Allerton Institute if you can).

Since waste will be frowned upon, bring with you "Junque" for recycling, remodeling, or both. "Junque" includes white elephants you are not using, but would feel guilty about throwing away, clothing, cloth, scraps, flowers, ribbons, wire, straws, etc. From your Junque to someone else's treasure---we hope.

What more can we ask?! Well, there will also be evening singing, old friends, new friends, iced tea breaks, walks through the beautiful grounds---

#### TREASURER'S REPORT

Bonnie Olson, treasurer, reports that she has received \$728.25 from the sale of "The Best in the Central Mid-West: cookbooks. This means that the CMDUUWF has realized a profit of \$374.95. Our thanks once again to the cookbook editors, Phyllis Maves Bell, and to the Rockford unit whose contribution of time and skill made this money-raiser available to the District.

The cookbooks proved to be an attractive addition to the book table at the UUWF Bicentennial Convention in Chicago, and a good number of them were sold at that time. Unit sales have been good also. However, there are still seventy-three books held by various units and still unaccounted for The hope is that they are sold and that by the time this newsletter is received a number of checks will have gone to Bonnie from Bloomington for 20 books Joliet for 15; Milwaukee, 10; Oak Park, 10; Peoria, 10; Chicago Heights, 5; and Madison, 3.

Bonnie also reminds all Units that dues (\$1.00 per member, payable to her) are needed to support the CMDUUWF and to help subsidize Allerton. Those Units whose dues are still outstanding are Bloomington, Beverly, Third Unitarian, Chicago Heights, Waltonville, Willmette, and Hobart.
