#### What about Membership?

How much does membership cost?

Your tax-deductible sustaining membership dues for an individual is \$10 for one year. For 2008, however, there is a special unit rate, which is \$8 per person for 8 or more memberships mailed in together.



• What do I get for my membership?

You receive our quarterly newsletter, *Voices of Women*, retreat brochures, UU Women's Connection program mailings, and the priceless satisfaction, which comes from supporting other UU women in our district through scholarships, grants, and programming. Additionally, you pool your resources with other women in the Central Midwest District to support organizations like the Religious Coalition for Reproductive Choice (RCRC) in Missouri and Illinois, The Clara Barton Washington Internship for Women.

What's the advantage of joining as a unit now?

If 8 or more women from one congregation send their membership dues in together, the cost of membership is reduced to \$8 per person. "Eight for eight in '08!"

What if I don't join?

You may certainly take advantage of UU Women's Connection programs but, sustaining membership dues and scholarship donations keep the UU Women's Connection active and accessible. Retreat registrations pay for retreats, but membership dues pay for scholarships, grants, women's programming, and charitable contributions. In 2007, UU Women's Connection contributed (Continued page two)

(Membership, continued) \$200 each to the Illinois and Missouri Religious Coalitions for Reproductive Choice (RCRC), \$400 to the UU Service Committee (UUSC), \$200 to the UU Women's Federation (UUWF) Margaret Fuller Grant Program, and \$1000 to the Clara Barton Washington Internship for Women. Sustaining membership dues help continue the UU Women's Connection support of these important causes.

## What's in an Acronym? Betty Jachim, Unity UU, Oak Park, Illinois

Seeing **CBS** beside a member's name doesn't mean she's a TV reporter/agent. It means her UU women's group has honored her with enrollment in the Clara Barton Sisterhood, named after our Universalist foremother and founder of the Red Cross. This special designation is open to UU women 80 or older. For more details and/or an enrollment form, go to www.uuwf.org

Another symbol, **HH**, is used for recipients of the Hester Huff Roll of Recognition, which was established to commemorate the exemplary role model who served as registrar and coordinator of the first of several Allerton Conferences. Till 1998, one of the highlights of the annual Allerton Conference was recognition of a district UU woman for her service to our organization, her church and community. Her name was added to the honor plaque, which she was entitled to keep until the following year's recipient was named. Interestingly, one year's recipient was a group, Chicago's Third Unitarian Alliance, whose women stayed together though their congregation split.

Finally, the **LIFE** title indicates a person who supports the UUWF organization with a single minimum contribution, which confers life membership. The UU Women's Connection continues to honor and thank these women with complimentary copies of all our newsletters.

**In Memory of Lorraine Bays Weber**, who passed away in January 2008. Lorraine, a member of the Champaign-Urbana Illinois UU Church, was official pianist at Allerton for many years. She attended most every Allerton Institute and served as an organist for the C-U Church at times. She was a grand lady and will be missed. Here Doris Jones of the C-U congregation and Allerton regular reminisces about Lorraine:

She could play any popular (or religious) song that you mentioned and would sit at the piano and play without music for a sing-along late into the night most years. She also played for worship services. One year I remember that a huge thunderstorm knocked down large trees in the park all around us after dinner. She asked me to gather everyone in the library where we lit candles and sang around the piano for over an hour before the power came back on. Some of the ladies were very nervous to say the least and lined up one by one to use the only phone to call their hubbies or significant others. Those were the days before computers or cell phones. Lorraine was crowned Miss Allerton and was a Hester Huff recipient.

## Historical Highlights: *VOW's* 40 Years. **2000-2008:** Making History.

This is the final Historical Highlights column. I have to admit that I am relieved. 40 years of *Voices of Women* produced at a pretty constant rate of at least two per year, and more as time went on, condensed into four columns is difficult at best. With the good reportage all those years aside, I still recognize that these *VOW*'s do not tell the complete story. People do. I have extrapolated these historical highlights from 2000-2008 *VOW*'s and my own 13 years experience as retreat planner, UUWF board member, Task Force Co-convener, as *Ad hoc* council member and, finally, as the UU Women's Connection Council Chair for the founding year of incorporation in 2006. I feel almost too close to it all to write these. What follows is one story -- mine -- with a major attempt at brevity. (Not one of my long suits)

The last *VOW* Historical Highlights column had 2000 President *pro temp* (and VP) Jeanne Fitch (Bloomington-Normal, Illinois) appealing for a president to step forward. In late 2000 Joanne Fought was convinced to complete the final year of the term. It was term number three for Joanne, (1987-1991) but who better to lead the organization through the agonizing decision to leave and begin looking for a site to replace the beloved Allerton venue where our history began 50 years ago this year.

In 2003 outgoing UUWF board president Karen Tajbl charged a newly formed task force to meet the desires of membership related to structure and organization and to deal with the crisis in leadership. By the July 2003 task force meeting it was clear that, though some changes were needed, the astounding consensus was to continue and to develop a plan to work with three focuses. Sue Thom, task force recorder, reported these crucial areas as: Structure, Communication and Programming. It is important to note that wonderful programming continued at the Lake Geneva Fall Retreats and the Spring Conferences during this period. The task force, ad hoc Council and, finally, our reorganized UU Women's Connection -- with its council form of governance relying on consensus and shared leadership, new bylaws, incorporation as a Non-profit 501 (c) (3) – accomplished its work.

I will leave out the details of a seven year search for a new "Allerton" Spring Conference location, the two years of bylaws rewriting, non-profit incorporation, revision of the retreat guidelines, search for leadership at council level and enlistment of conference planning committees. One exciting new endeavor during this time, a granted program called "Peace Works for All" birthed our present grants program. Other goals since our first official meeting have been set, are in process or have been reached in this, the Connection's third year.

By the Summer 2003 *VOW* the task force set a course to work with structure, communication and programming and to develop and distribute a questionnaire asking members to prioritize areas of need. It was no surprise that the item of prime importance was "Continuing retreats." Even some members who couldn't attend the two annual conferences wished to continue supporting the idea of women getting together at accessible, affordable retreats. "We know the value of nourishing our spirits, our bodies, our souls and our minds. We enjoy—we need—being together with like-minded women!

Joanne Fought notified membership in 2000 of the decision to leave Allerton with these words: I know that loving memories, beautiful spaces, life-time friendships and lasting traditions are part of Allerton, but they remain intact, although the lovely buildings, spectacular grounds and accommodating staff will be missed. We need to grieve, but also carry the caring, fun-loving best features that were part of the Allerton time to our new location. I think I am beginning to understand the importance of the Allerton idea.

Now coming full circle as we return to Monticello to celebrate our history with pride and look again to a bright future during and after the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary year, it is worth mentioning our continued support of the Continental UUWF through annual gifts to the Clara Barton Washington Internship for Women and use and promotion of various other UUWF programs

In the Spring 2005 VOW the ad hoc council of seven set about to renew the organizational vision and present recommendations at the 2005 Annual meeting in June with the following requirements for inclusion: Continued inspirational, accessible, affordable retreats and conferences, additional educational activities, continued gift giving for worthwhile causes and continued support for scholarships and grants. A new name was recommended, "UU Women's Connection of the Central Midwest District" and after a bylaws rewrite, a myriad of applications, federal and state, the first Council meeting of the UU Women's Connection convened in January 2006. That, as they say, is history.
