2010 Annual Report -P. Goller, Chair

Review of the UU Women's Connection 2010 year, begun before the Annual Meeting in November was finalized a few days before Christmas with a council conference call. 2010 was a year of programming highs and another financial blow at Lake Geneva. It's a time for not-for-profits to hunker down, re-evaluate and strategize for the future and UU Women's Connection is no exception. The highlights of the year follow, as does the 2011 budget, which includes continued belt tightening. The next VOW will list 2011 goals and priorities and look at council strategic planning.

 **2010 program highlights:** The Connection awarded a \$500 grant to the Carbondale Unitarian Congregation in late 2009 to bring singing group, Emma's Revolution to Carbondale's Zambia Hospice/Orphanage Project fundraiser in February, 2010. In March the Connection presented a woman's leadership event planned with W&R committee at Third Unitarian Church in Chicago and assistance from the Chicago Area UU Council with a \$500 grant. Called "Women as Agents of Change," it celebrated those who lead in the style of UU foremother, Margaret Fuller. The Margaret Fuller salons conducted that day were the beginning of many salons the councilors would facilitate in 2010, the 200th Anniversary year of Margaret Fuller's birth.

These salons, retreats, other programming and quarterly business meetings took Councilors around the district from the February concert in Carbondale to Third U in Oak Park, Illinois and Beverly U on Chicago's South Side, to Prairie Fellowship in Madison, Wisconsin, and to Alton, Illinois UU Church near St Louis and finally to Williams Bay, Wisconsin. Thanks to the hospitality of congregations we are able to hear the voices of women of the Central Midwest District in 2010 through our traveling quarterly meetings and other projects.

Spring Conference, 2010 and Beyond

With the outstanding work of the Springfield, Illinois planners, a much lauded spring conference with keynote, Teri Freesmeyer took place at Pilgrim Park Retreat Center near Princeton, Illinois in June. "S.P.A. for the Soul" was a relaxing, warm and welcoming weekend. So, we are happy to announce that Teri will be **back by popular demand** with a district-wide committee already at work to plan the 2011 conference, June 3-5, 2011.

For **spring 2012** Council has secured keynote, Pam Hinkle with Bonnie Ettinger for the June 8-10, 2012 conference. Pam is creator, past director of the Heartland Music Fest in Indiana and director of the Indianapolis Women's Chorus; and Bonnie, pianist extraordinaire from ALUUC in Springfield, Illinois are the popular musical duo from Summer Assembly who will guide the weekend. Lake Geneva Saturday's opener with Cathy Kline, Makanda, Illinois Councilor, taught us how to use a *balance wheel* to measure our personal balance. Then a *Reiki energy workshop* presented by Debbie Czarnopys-White, Dubois, Illinois, aimed to help us achieve balance, order, and wellness in our lives.

In a *meditation/prayer bead workshop*, presented by Sage Hagy of North Shore, Deerfield, Illinois, we made meditation prayer beads and discussed what the term "prayer" meant to us. *Keepers of the Beat* workshop was presented by Heather Poyner, popular Kenosha, Wisconsin drummer. We made and decorated a frame drum. Drum makers then had an opportunity to use the newly created drums on Saturday evening with Heather and finally to show them off at the Sunday closing.

We colored mandalas, sacred circles with intricate designs, which symbolize the beauty and impermanence of life. Saturday night saw us doing puzzles, playing board games, and chatting into the night. A "Star Party" on Saturday evening, had some of us gazing into the heavens and hearing about the history of Yerkes Observatory. Other opportunities included a boat trip on the lake or serious time sleeping, reading or walking, bird watching or just following our own instincts.

Sunday's closing was bittersweet. We played drums and other rhythm instruments, sang and chanted. Finally, we took time to remember and honor Emily Meter, (North Shore planning leader in 2007 and many other times) who just months before she died summoned the strength to come to Lake Geneva for the 2009 Fall Retreat. We closed our circle, being thankful for a weekend of joy, sharing, and healing, and looking forward to meeting again.



Fall Retreat Financials: The programming success of the fall weekend was a demonstration of the talents and cohesiveness of Councilors. But when the fall retreat invoice arrived from George Williams before Christmas, we knew that an impending conference call would ask for a vote to stay or leave George Williams Retreat Center.

Though it is not surprising after the struggles of the last few years, the falling numbers and difficulty in enlisting planners, **we are sad to announce that we will not return to George Williams Retreat Center.** Council no longer feels a reasonably priced weekend for women can be provided at

George Williams without raising registration fees. Not disheartened though, we have opted instead to seek another other type of programming, perhaps a number of smaller programs, trips or events. Even another retreat location is possible. Councilors will be discussing many options before and at the first quarter business meeting in March when we return together to Williams Bay for the weekend to brainstorm and strategize with the leadership of newly elected officers: Diana DeWeese, chair; Debbie Czarnopys-White, vice chair, Tori Kilhoffer, recorder and Nicole Nichols, treasurer; new councilors, Sage Hagy and Juli Cicarelli and returning councilors, Pat Goller and Cathy Kline.

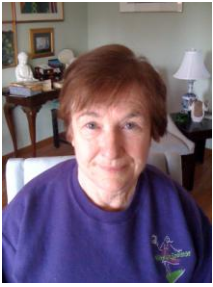
