Reflections on the Spring Retreat

WORKSHOPS

Singing in Sacred Circle

Singing in Sacred Circle is an opportunity to look into your sister's eyes and share voice and spirit through song. While learning short, repetitive women-centered songs from a variety of traditions, power rises from the center of the circle as all voices create an energy that is both empowering and healing. This opportunity is intended to allow women, regardless of singing experience, to share their voices in a noncompetitive , relaxed, safe space. Come sing along!

Shelly Graff is a feminist singer, songwriter, guitarist, and Singing in Sacred Circle facilitator. She has been sharing her songs with audiences throughout the past twenty-one years. Her folksy, personable approach to performing and facilitating Singing in Sacred Circle workshops draws her audiences down a path of political inquiry, peace, healing, and transformation.

Drumming Our Way Home

Since the beginning of humankind, cultures throughout the globe have sat in circles to express themselves through percussion song. What prompted our foremothers and fathers to gather in a circle? What is the effect on us as we create percussion in community today? Participants will take a journey into "drum circle communion" through hands-on drumming. Learn how the ancients did it and how the drum circle continues to work its magic and medicine. Some instruments provided, but please feel free to bring your own!

Create your own Declaration of Independence!

Explore your creative side, your way, with a visual or written art project. You will take home your own piece of creative genius as an inspired and inspirational memento of the weekend, and a reminder of your personal strengths, fortitude and MORE! What more could you ask for at a Women's Retreat?

Make your own Native American Flute

Limited to 10 participants (Materials Fee T.B.D.)

Here is an opportunity for you to explore a unique instrument that produces the warm heartfelt sound that has come to be identified with the spiritual and cultural ethos of the Native American. We will learn the simple fingering for the basic pentatonic scale and play a few simple melodies. Each woman will paint and decorate her "plain vanilla" white flute made from PVC pipe so that it will be uniquely hers!



The knowledge of how to draw a "classical" labyrinth and how to transfer that skill to the construction of a full size labyrinth on the ground, has been passed from one generation to another for thousands of years. In this workshop, we will learn a foolproof method for drawing the classical labyrinth and creating a labyrinth of your own.

Bring a t-shirt, or several, to embellish with beads, labyrinth iron-on transfers, or make a crazy t-shirt quilt.



The Goddess Diaries – a CD created by Carol Lee Campbell. She created the Diaries as an experiment after years of working as a women's advocate in the DC area. Inspired to produce a show about real women's lives she asked women in her community, many of them members of her congregation, to write down their stores and then she tied them together through a common thread: the agricultural seasons of the year. Borrowed from the ancient Western European calendar of equinoxes, solstices and cross-quarter days, each monologue represent a specific time in the growing/harvest season and each season becomes a metaphor for these life events.

The Water Ritual by Carolyn McDade and Lucile Longview – the script for the original workshop service *Coming Home, Like Rivers to the Sea: A Woman's Ritual* – distributed at the 1997 General Assembly of the UUA in Phoenix, Arizona.

Return to Wholeness, The New Book of Crone Stones by Carol Lee Campbell. Accompanying the book is a set of crone stones created by the author.

Rise Up and Call Her Name – a woman-honoring journey into Global Earth-based Spiritualities written and edited by Elizabeth Fisher. Leader's Guide, Sourcebook, music CD, and DVD.

Unraveling the Gender Knot – Challenging the Systems that Binds Us – by Barbara Schonborn, Alison Campbell, and Rosemary Matson – a Study Guide for the book - *The Gender Knot – Unraveling our Patriarchal Legacy* by Allan G. Johnson which can purchased through the UUA Bookstore online. The course examines ways the patriarchal system we live in affects girls and women, boys and men.

Becoming Women of Wisdom – Marking the Passages into the Crone Years – a curriculum in thirteen circles – by Melody Lee with Karen Edwards and Dorothy May Emerson. The curriculum is designed to prepare women to take on the important role of Wise Women in their communities.

Goddess Gatherings - Thirteen sessions for a year of study in a small circle of friends by Melinda Morris Perrin.

Cakes for the Queen of Heaven - Part 1 - In Ancient Times, and Part 2 - On The Threshold

We also have **The Queen of Myself** by Donna Henes.
